| An Assistant Teacher must be 18 years of age and meet one of the education requirements below: An associate or more advanced degree; OR A high school diploma or its equivalent and a current Child Development Associate (CDA) credential, which specifies that the individual is qualified for the assigned age classification; OR A high school diploma or its equivalent and certification of training and competence in the field of early childhood education or early childhood development from a duly authorized | |
| vocational high school; OR A high school diploma or its equivalent <u>and</u> at least one (1) year of supervised occupational experience working with children in a licensed District of Columbia Child Development Center or its equivalent in another jurisdiction; OR For a Montessori school Assistant Teacher, have earned a minimum of twenty (20) hours of Montessori specific training, completed an orientation program specific to the school, and work under the supervision of a Montessori credentialed lead teacher | |

<u>Note:</u> Assistant teachers who do not teach in a Montessori school must earn a Child Development Associate (CDA) credential or an associate degree or higher in any field by December 2019.

Pre-K Enhancement and Expansion Program Education Requirements (per regulations)

An Assistant Teacher in a Pre-K Enhancement and Expansion Program classroom must meet one of the education requirements below:

- Hold at least an associate's degree in child development, early childhood education, early childhood special education, or child and family studies; OR
- Hold an associate's degree in a field other than child development, early childhood education, early childhood special education, or child and family studies and have earned nine (9) credits in early childhood education
